



## Phillips G. Davies Graduate Student Paper Award

The Phillips G. Davies Graduate Student Paper Award recognizes the best graduate student paper submitted to the NAES conference.

**Phillips G. Davies** graduated from Marquette University in 1946 and held advanced degrees from Northwestern University. He taught in the English department at Iowa State University in Ames beginning in 1954.

### Submission Process

1. Student must be currently enrolled in a graduate program;
2. Only papers accepted for the current year NAES Conference and paid members are eligible for this award;
3. The paper length should be between 10 and 15 pages including the works-cited pages; please use 12-point font, double-spaced, and one-inch margins;
4. The paper must demonstrate originality, creativity, and a potential for contribution to the field of Ethnic Studies;
5. Co-authored papers are not eligible.

All submissions and supporting materials must be received by **FEBRUARY 15, 2018**.
