



Phillips G. Davies Graduate Student Paper Award

The Phillips G. Davies Graduate Student Paper Award recognizes the best graduate student paper submitted to the NAES conference.

Phillips G. Davies graduated from Marquette University in 1946 and held advanced degrees from Northwestern University. He taught in the English department at Iowa State University in Ames beginning in 1954.

Submission Process

1. Student must be currently enrolled in a graduate program;
2. Only papers accepted for the current year NAES Conference and paid members are eligible for this award;
3. The paper length should be between 10 and 15 pages including the works-cited pages; please use 12-point font, double-spaced, and one-inch margins;
4. The paper must demonstrate originality, creativity, and a potential for contribution to the field of Ethnic Studies;
5. Co-authored papers are not eligible.

All submissions and supporting materials must be received by **FEBRUARY 15, 2018**.
